

YOUTH DAIRY & BEEF DEPARTMENTS

General Rules for Dairy & Beef:

1. Read all rules governing the Otsego County Fair. They must be followed in addition to these general rules.
2. 4-H and the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) members must follow their club rules and all Fair rules.
3. All cattle native and out-of-state entered in exhibitions, expositions, or fairs must follow the MDA Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan.
4. All cattle are required to have an official radio frequency identification device (RFID) ear tag.
5. An official movement certificate is required to be obtained prior to movement of any cattle from any premises in the Modified Accredited zone. Cattle being transported must be accompanied by a movement certificate(s) and the movement certificate(s) shall be produced upon request.
6. Movement Testing Requirements to a FAIR within the Modified Accredited Advance Zone – Cattle originating from herds that have been determined to have a Verified Wildlife Risk Mitigation Plan..NO TB testing required. Cattle originating from herds that have been determined to NOT have a Verified Wildlife Risk Mitigation Plan – Cattle must comply with one of the following prior to movement:
 - Originate directly from a bovine tuberculosis accredited free herd, or,
 - Receive a negative bovine tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to movement.
7. Cattle less than 2 months of age may be moved if they originate from a herd that is determined to not be overdue on tuberculosis surveillance testing.
8. Exhibitor must be a member of either 4-H or OCYLP to show/sell market animals.
9. Any animal deemed unworthy will not be awarded a premium.
10. Entry Tags must be displayed properly.
11. Dairy Club exhibit must consist of at least 3 animals shown by 3 owners from this section. Entries in this class number must be made on an entry form in the name of the club.
12. Market Beef Club exhibit must consist of at least 4 animals shown by 3 owners from DEPARTMENT 4, Sections 001-004. Entries in this class number must be made on an entry form in the name of the club.
13. Breeding Cattle Produce of Dam exhibit must consist of 2 animals, either sex, any age, from the same dam. Entry need not be owned entirely by exhibitor.

Dairy ages are computed as follows:

- Junior heifer calf born after January 1 of current year.
- Senior heifer calf born between July 1 of prior year and January 1 of current year.
- Junior yearling born between January 1 of prior year and July 1 of current year.
- Senior yearling born between July 1 two years prior and January 1 of current year.

General Rules:

1. Read all rules governing the Otsego County Fair. They must be followed in addition to these general rules.
2. 4-H and the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) members must follow their club rules and all Fair rules.
3. Junior Youth exhibitors 5-8 year olds are non-competitive classes and will receive ribbons only. No premiums will be paid. Parent or guardian must be on the grounds, and in the arena for a child to show.
4. All sheep native and out-of-state entered in exhibitions, expositions, or fairs must follow the MDA Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan.
5. All sheep moved within Michigan shall be identified with official USDA scrapie program identification tags prior to movement off the farm. Contact the USDA at 866-873-2824 for ear tags.
6. Do not remove the scrapie tags prior to weigh-in or showing. It is illegal to remove the official USDA individual animal identification.
7. Exhibitor must be a member of either 4-H or the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) to show/sell market animals.
8. Tail docking length specifications for lambs has been determined. The tail can be lifted from the exterior. Tails that do not meet this requirement will result in the animal being disqualified from the exhibition.
9. The date for computing the age of sheep is September 1.
10. Any animal deemed unworthy will not be awarded a premium.
11. Entry Tags must be displayed properly.

General Show Rules:

1. No muzzles on lambs at any time.
2. Pens to be bedded with natural material (wood shavings, straw, etc.), no carpet.
3. While in the show ring the lamb is to be shown with all four feet on the ground or ring surface.
4. Water must be available in pens at all times except twelve hours prior to entering show ring.
5. Humane handling practices of sheep at all times.
6. No liquid feeding of lambs.
7. Tail docking see general rule #8.

A quarantined swine should not be on the premises for any reason, except under a permit for the Director of Agriculture or his authorized agent.
8. Exhibitor must be a member of either 4-H or the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) to show/sell market animals.
9. Any animal deemed unworthy will not be awarded a premium.
10. Entry Tags must be displayed properly.

YOUTH MINI & POT BELLY PIG

General Rules:

1. Read all rules governing the Otsego County Fair. They must be followed in addition to these general rules.
2. 4-H and the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) members must follow their club rules and all Fair rules.
3. All pigs native and out-of-state entered in exhibitions, expositions, or fairs must follow the MDA Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan.
4. All pigs for exhibition must be free of infectious and contagious disease.
5. Native pigs are not required to be vaccinated against hog cholera.
6. All pigs shall be uniquely identified with individual ear tag identification or other identification approved by the MDA. Pigs staying the entire week of the fair must have individual ear tag identification. Pigs brought in one hour prior and leaving when judging is finished DO NOT have to have individual ear tag identification.
7. Pigs may stay the entire week of the fair or brought to the fairgrounds one hour prior to judging and must be taken home immediately after judging.
8. Youth exhibitors must be nine years of age or older by January 1 of the current year to participate in the mini and pot belly pig classes.
9. Junior Youth exhibitors 5-8 year olds are non-competitive classes and will receive ribbons only. No premiums will be paid.
10. Exhibitor ages for showmanship are as follows: Senior (14 years old and older), Junior (9-13 year olds)
11. Pigs must be shown with a harness.
12. Mini pig weight, no more than 50 pounds.
13. Pot Belly pig weight & height, weight no more than 125 pounds, height no more than 18" tall.

3. Junior Youth exhibitors 5-8 year olds are non-competitive classes and will receive ribbons only. No premiums will be paid.
4. Exhibitor ages for showmanship are as follows: Senior (14 years old and older), Junior (9-13 years old), Novice (first year exhibitors only).
5. Exhibitor will not share their poultry or waterfowl with another exhibitor. Once it has been shown it cannot be shown by someone else. The exception would be that it can be shown in showmanship.
6. All poultry native and out-of-state entered in exhibitions, expositions, or fairs must follow the MDA Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan.
7. Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own feed.
8. Entry tags must be displayed properly.
9. All exhibitors must attend the small animal barn meeting on entry day.
10. Each exhibitor entered in the fair must work at least one shift of barn duty during fair week or forfeit premiums. Sign-up for barn duty will be at the Small Animal Barn Meeting on entry day.
11. All youth exhibitors must be present during judging and must handle the animal or they will be disqualified.
12. A youth exhibitor must bring their entry to the judging table. If anyone other than the exhibitor brings and puts an entry on the judging table the entry will be disqualified.
13. Pens will be provided.
14. All poultry must be pollorum free before entering the barn.
15. The poultry exhibits must be examined by the barn superintendent before entering the barn.
16. Anyone displaying a dozen eggs must also exhibit a laying hen.
17. Exhibition cages must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected, both prior to and following such exhibitions.
18. Any animal deemed unworthy will not be awarded a premium.
19. Padlocks will not be used on cages.

4-H/OCYLP MARKET PEN RULES:

1. Exhibitor must be a member of either 4-H or the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) to show/sell market animals.
2. 4-H and the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) members must follow their club rules and all Fair rules.
3. Market pens MUST be weighed by noon on entry day.
4. Exhibitors must register on the entry form for a market pen or exhibitor will not be allowed to sell.
5. Exhibitors of market pens need to fill out a market exhibit card on entry day, including dates of birth or hatch, weight of each market animal and breed.
6. Uniformity of sex, color and weight within a pen is desirable.

3. Junior Youth exhibitors 5-8 year olds are non-competitive classes and will receive ribbons only. No premiums will be paid.
4. Exhibitor age for showmanship are as follows: Senior (14 years old and older), Junior (9-13 years old), Novice (first year exhibitors only)
5. Exhibitor will not share their rabbit with another exhibitor. Once it has been shown it cannot be shown by someone else. The exception would be showmanship.
6. All rabbits native and out-of-state entered in exhibitions, expositions, or fairs must follow the MDA Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan.

7. Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own feed.
8. Entry tags must be displayed properly.
9. All exhibitors must attend the small animal barn meeting on entry day.
10. Each exhibitor entered in the fair must work at least one shift of barn duty during fair week or forfeit premiums. Sign-up for barn duty will be at the Small Animal Barn Meeting on entry day.
11. All youth exhibitors must be present during judging and must handle the animal or they will be disqualified.
12. A youth exhibitor must bring their entry to the judging table. If anyone other than the exhibitor brings and puts an entry on the judging table the entry will be disqualified.
13. Pens will be provided.
14. The rabbit exhibits must be examined by the barn superintendent before entering the barn.
15. Anyone displaying wool/fiber from a rabbit must also display a rabbit.
16. Exhibition cages must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected, both prior to and following such exhibitions.
17. Any animal deemed unworthy will not be awarded a premium.
18. Padlocks will not be used on cages.
19. If you need assistance with rabbit breed identification feel free to call the fair office at 989-732-3811.

4-H/OCYLP MARKET PEN RULES:

1. Exhibitor must be a member of either 4-H or the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) to show/sell market animals.
2. 4-H and the Otsego County Youth Livestock Program (OCYLP) members must follow their club rules and all Fair rules.
3. Market pens MUST be weighed by noon on entry day.
4. Exhibitors must register on the entry form for a market pen or exhibitor will not be allowed to sell.
5. Exhibitors of market pens need to fill out a market exhibit card on entry day, including dates of birth or hatch, weight of each market animal and breed.
6. Uniformity of sex, color and weight within a pen is desirable.

Determining cage sizes for rabbits, use the following guidelines:

- Under 5 pounds, small cage
- Between 5 and 9 pounds, medium cage
- Over 9 pounds, large cage
- Doe and litter small breed, medium cage
- Doe and litter medium to large breed, large cage
- Meat pens, large cage
